Battle of the Bands: Rules & Guidelines

1. Eligibility

• The competition is open to all bands, regardless of genre

2. Entry Requirements

- All bands must submit the completed entry form by deadline October 15, 2025
- Each entry must include a band bio, a link to a demo, and social media handles if applicable
- Each entry form must be accompanied by \$50 non-refundable entry fee in the form of cash or check made payable to: The Russell County Bicentennial

3. Performance Requirements

- Each band will be allotted a 10 minute sound check plus 20 minutes to perform a live set
- The set must be performed with live instruments (no backing tracks, pre-recorded vocals, etc.).
- Bands can play original songs or covers
- (1) Song must be from this list:
 - **The Star-Spangled Banner** National Anthem of the United States.
 - **♣** America the Beautiful A song celebrating the beauty of the United States.
 - **↓** God Bless America A patriotic anthem that expresses hope and prayer for the country.
 - **↓ This Land Is Your Land** A folk song written by Woody Guthrie celebrating the American landscape.
 - **♣** America (My Country, 'Tis of Thee) A classic patriotic song often sung during American events.
 - **Born in the U.S.A.** Bruce Springsteen's anthem reflecting on American life.
 - **↓** The Battle Hymn of the Republic A historic song often associated with the American Civil War.
 - **↓** Courtesy of the Red, White and Blue Toby Keith's song expressing pride in the American military
 - Some Gave All, by Billy Ray Cyrus A stoic reminder that freedom has a high price and is a patriotic song delivered on Veterans Day and beyond.
 - **Take Me Home County Roads, by John Denver** A folk song that transcends our nation
 - → Only in America, by Brooks & Dunn Our nation is made up of many different people, cultures, and dreams. That's the beauty of the American Dream
- All performances & attire must adhere to community standards (e.g., no offensive language or inappropriate content).

4. Judging Criteria

Battle of the Bands: Scoring Rubric

Each category will be scored on a scale of **1** to **10**, with **1** being the lowest and **10** being the highest. Judges will assign a score in each category based on the band's performance.

1. Musical Talent (Technical Ability, Musicianship, and Overall Performance Quality)

- **10**: Flawless technical ability with exceptional musicianship. The performance is tight, synchronized, and well-executed by every member.
- 7–9: Strong technical skills and good musicianship, with minor flaws that don't detract from the overall performance.
- 4–6: Competent musical performance, but there are noticeable issues in timing, execution, or musical complexity.
- 1–3: Weak technical skills or significant performance flaws that affect the overall musical quality.

2. Stage Presence (Ability to Engage and Entertain the Audience)

- 10: Charismatic and energetic stage presence that captivates the audience. The band interacts with the crowd and maintains high energy throughout the performance.
- 7–9: Solid stage presence with engaging moments, though it may lack consistency in audience interaction or energy levels.
- 4–6: Average stage presence. The band performs well but doesn't fully engage the audience or convey a strong sense of connection.
- 1–3: Limited stage presence or energy, with minimal engagement or interaction with the audience.

3. Originality (Creativity in Songwriting, Arrangement, and Performance Style)

- 10: Highly original, fresh, and unique in songwriting, arrangements, and performance style. The band stands out as innovative and distinct.
- 7–9: Original, though it may draw from existing influences. The songwriting, arrangements, and performance style are creative but not entirely unique.
- 4–6: Some originality but relies on common musical formulas or styles. The performance may lack a distinct voice or identity.
- 1–3: Little to no originality. The performance feels derivative or uncreative, with no unique aspects.

4. Audience Response (Crowd's Reaction to the Band's Performance)

- 10: The audience is fully engaged and enthusiastic, showing clear appreciation through cheers, applause, and excitement.
- 7–9: The audience responds positively, with moments of engagement, but not as consistently throughout the performance.

- 4–6: The audience's response is average or mixed, with some moments of enthusiasm but overall low engagement.
- 1–3: The audience is largely disinterested or unresponsive to the performance.

5. Overall Impact (Ability to Stand Out and Leave a Lasting Impression)

- 10: The band leaves a powerful, lasting impression with a memorable performance that sets them apart from the competition. They stand out both musically and in stage presence.
- 7–9: A solid performance that stands out but doesn't have a lasting impact or memorable quality.
- 4–6: The band's performance is good but forgettable. They may blend in with the other bands or fail to make a strong impression.
- 1–3: The performance doesn't leave a lasting impact and is easily forgettable.

Total Score Calculation: Each category will be scored on a scale from **1 to 10**. The total maximum score per band is **50 points**.

5. Competition Format

• Only one band will be chosen as the winner and will headline the event on October 18, 2025.

6. Prizes

- Winner \$1500 plus headline the event on October 18, 2025 @ the Bicentennial Festival
- 2nd Place \$750
- 3rd Place \$500

7. Behavior and Conduct

- All band members and supporters must behave in a professional and respectful manner throughout the competition.
- Any form of harassment, misconduct, or damaging behavior towards other participants, event staff, or attendees will result in immediate disqualification.
- The event organizers reserve the right to remove any participant who violates the rules or engages in inappropriate conduct.

8. Equipment

- Bands are responsible for bringing their own instruments and equipment, unless otherwise specified.

• Soundchecks will be provided before each performance, and all bands must arrive at least 30 minutes prior to their scheduled performance time.

9. Performance Times

- Bands must adhere to the scheduled performance time and be ready to perform promptly.
- Late arrivals or failure to perform within the allotted time may result in point deductions or disqualification.

10. Cancellation & Changes

- If a band needs to cancel their participation after entry, they must inform the organizers as soon as possible.
- The event organizers reserve the right to modify the rules or schedule, if necessary, with prior notice to the participants.

11. Copyright & Permissions

- Bands are responsible for ensuring that they have the legal rights to perform any copyrighted songs or material during the competition.
- By participating, bands grant the event organizers permission to record and use their performances, images, and music for promotional purposes, including social media, websites, and marketing materials.

12. Liability

- The event organizers are not responsible for any injuries or damages incurred by participants or their equipment before, during, or after the event.
- Participants agree to indemnify the event organizers and their affiliates from any claims arising out of their involvement in the competition.
